As a child Emily attended Democratic Breakfasts and meetings with her parents and she canvassed for Hillary Clinton. However, it was the night of the General Election of 2016 when she became more fired up about working to make a difference. The next day she started the Polk County Association of Teen Democrats at Polk County High School and she hasn't looked back –
