

North Carolina Coordinated Campaign Campus Fellow

The North Carolina Democratic Coordinated Campaign is seeking Campus Fellows in North Carolina. The Democratic Party values the political power of young people and seeks to increase it by engaging them in electoral politics.

This is an educational opportunity for anyone passionate about advancing the priorities of young people through electoral politics. Campus Fellows will learn how to contact and motivate voters, execute voter contact plans (tabling, door knocking, texting and calling), participate in content creation, and interact with candidates and political staffers. There will be opportunities for Fellows to pilot their own ideas as they support Coordinated Campaign staff. Fellows will gain extensive networking opportunities, acquire new skills, and be provided with a stipend.

The ideal Campus Fellow will be able to dedicate 10 hours weekly to campaign work. They will be organized, possess a strong social battery, and be willing to engage strangers about politics diplomatically and strategically to win votes for Democrats. The work will require social resilience, persistence, creativity, and pragmatism.

Campus Fellows will report to a Regional Campus Director.

Description

- Mobilize their student campus communities to help elect Democrats up and down the ballot
- Plan, recruit for, attend, and staff weekly campus events ranging from teach-ins to candidate visits to workshops and fun competitions, in collaboration with Regional Campus Director
- Create content for and engage on different media platforms, including a weekly video drawn from talking points provided by the campaign (or approved by the Campus Mobilizing Director)
- Learn how to use different tools and manage data for voter contact programs
- Knock doors, conduct high-traffic canvassing (cafeterias, pedestrian areas, etc.), text and phonebank
- Build relationships with campus organizations and activist groups friendly to Democratic campaigns
- Attend bi-weekly all-hands check-ins facilitated by the Regional Campus Director
- Participate in training opportunities

- Other duties as assigned

You'll be a good fit for this role if you have...

- Are currently enrolled in a four-year college/university or a community/technical college
- Past campaign experience
- A strong social battery, sense of diplomacy, and desire for mentorship/coaching
- A commitment to building political power for young voters through electoral engagement and a pragmatic approach to the intersection of issue-based advocacy and winning elections
- The ability and desire to thrive in a fast-pace, irregular work environment

Stipend:

Fellows will work 10 hours per week and receive \$1800 total in stipends over the summer. Stipends will be paid in two increments, one at the midway point and the second at the end of the fellowship.
